Creating Sustainable Projects

June 4-8, 2022, at Sunny Hill in Slovenia

AIM

The training aims to form international teams around promising ideas for new projects under the ERASMUS+ programme: projects with and for youth in ecovillages and sustainability projects.

CONTENT

We will explore the new programme generation's possibilities and get background knowledge relevant to youth projects. The participants will improve their skills and expertise in project design.

For inspiration, the more experienced participants and facilitators will share real-life examples of successful projects, painting a realistic picture of the practicalities of working with funded projects. Looking both at what worked well and what didn't, participants will learn about the possible challenges in international youth projects and how to minimise them through good project design.

The networking aspect of the project will create a lot of new connections between the participants and the organisations they represent and lead to more collaboration through the future projects conceived here.

FACILITATORS

The facilitators are Ulrike Schimmel (Germany), Petra Jazbec (Slovenia) and Manja Vrenko (Slovenia).

WHEN

The training takes place from May 4-8, 2022, and participants must participate for the entire duration. The arrival day is May 3 and the departure day is on May 9.

WHO IS THIS TRAINING FOR?

This training is for those who plan to start or continue working with ERASMUS+ youth projects in ecovillages and sustainability projects. Participants need to be committed to getting involved in at least one of the new projects developed during this training.

TRAINING COURSE

Participants must be residents in the country of the sending or receiving organisation: Slovenia, Spain, The Netherlands, Czech Republic, Greece, Italy, Poland, Hungary, Croatia, and Germany.

Ukraine and Russia are partner organisations, however, we are still clarifying how to address the situation with the National Agency.

LANGUAGE

The language of the training is English.

COSTS

An EU grant covers food and accommodation at the venue as well as the training itself. A travel grant may or may not be enough to cover actual costs, so you might need to top it up.

At the moment there is no testing required to enter Slovenia. But there may be for your way back home. The required covid-19 tests can be (partially) covered from the surplus of the travel grant, if applicable. The rest will have to be paid for by the participants themselves.
